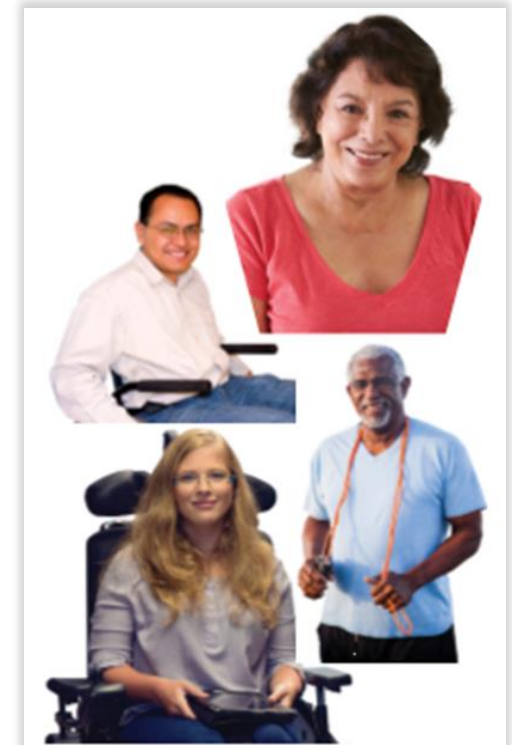

◆ Health and Wellness

Today there are many ways that someone can stay healthy and avoid injury. The ADRC can make connections for you with our Senior Services Program that will support your best possible health and safety.

◆ Information and Assistance

Information and Assistance Specialists provide you with knowledge about services, programs, and solutions for disability and long-term care issues such as living arrangements, health, adult protective services, employment and training for people with disabilities, home maintenance, nutrition, Social Security, and publicly funded programs.

◆ Long-Term Care Options Counseling

Information and Assistance Specialists provide information about the choices available to meet your long-term care needs. We help you make an informed decision to meet your needs.

◆ Long-Term Care Benefit Access

The ADRC is the entryway to publicly funded long-term care programs. The ADRC will help assess your level of need for services and advise you of your eligibility.

◆ Vital Connections

If you or someone you know is at risk of abuse or neglect, losing housing or heat, the ADRC is there to help connect you with someone who will respond to your urgent situation.
