Three-Party Commitment Petition

If a person is willing to seek help on a voluntary basis, there is no need to pursue a Three-Party Petition. You may contact Information & Assistance at 262-638-6741 to inquire about treatment options or, if the person seeking services is insured, call the phone number on the back of their insurance card for treatment referrals.

Since Wisconsin is a least restrictive state, the law governing our mental health system (Chapter 51) emphasizes protecting individual rights and liberties. The laws favor voluntary over involuntary treatment. However, there are three ways in which to force involuntary treatment in the State of Wisconsin:

- Emergency Detention
- Director's Petition (also known as Director's Hold)
- Three-Party Petition
